
Mini project # 2 — sample



The Book of Deer was produced in the 10th century and contains all sorts of intricate knotwork. This work is thought to have been produced in the northeast of Scotland, and may be the oldest surviving Scottish book.



Consider the link running down the length of the right of the page shown. This depicts an alternating, two-bridge link of two components — the components have been coloured green and purple. Notice that each component is unknotted.
