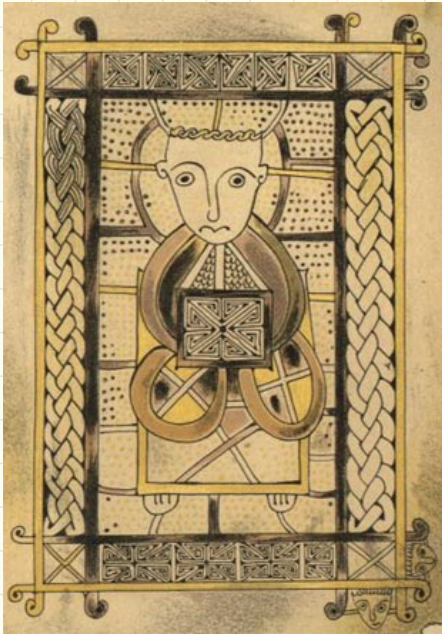
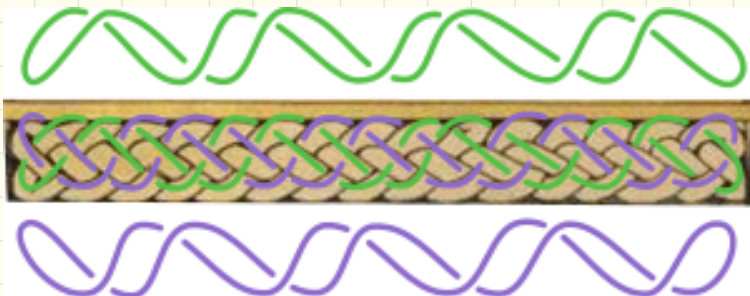


# Mini project # 2 — sample



The Book of Deer was produced in the 10th century and contains all sorts of intricate knotwork. This work is thought to have been produced in the north-east of Scotland, and may be the oldest surviving Scottish book.



Consider the link running down the length of the right of the page shown. This depicts an alternating, two-bridge link of two components — the components have been coloured green and purple. Notice that each component is unknotted.
